Student Finance

The two main costs of HE are:



Tuition fees

- Charged by the university each year to cover the costs of things like lecturers & facilities
- SFE offer a Tuition Fee Loan of up to £9,250 per year (UCW charge £8250)
- This loan is paid directly to the university
- The amount of tuition fee loan you can get is not dependent on household income



Living costs

- E.g. rent, food, travel, course trips/books
- SFE offer a Maintenance Loan to help with these costs
- The amount of maintenance loan you get is based on two factors:
 - where you will live during your studies
 - · household income
- The maintenance loan is paid directly to the student at the start of each term



Extra Funding

Bursaries

- Linked to personal circumstances (e.g. household income under £25,000, young carer)
- Can be used as a tuition fees/accommodation waiver or paid directly to the student
- UCW Bursary is £2000

Scholarships

- Linked to high academic results or previously studying at Weston College
- Progression Scholarship -£300
- Excellence Scholarship £350
- Federation of Schools Scholarship - £300
- Part Time Scholarship -£1,500

Grants from SFE

- Grants are available if you have a child or adult who's financially dependent on you
- Parental Learning
 Allowance/Childcare
 Grant/Adult Dependent Grant



Repaying Student Loans

In order to start paying back the tuition fee & maintenance loans, you must meet a set of criteria:

- Full time students will be eligible for repayments from the April after graduating or leaving their course.
- There is a repayment threshold, this means if you don't earn over this amount per year you won't make repayments. Currently set at £26,575 (2020/21).
- When graduates earn over the threshold, they repay 9% of their income over the threshold (see example on next slide). If a graduate's income falls below the threshold, their repayments will stop.
- Any outstanding loan balance will be cancelled 30 years after entering repayment process.
- Repayments are automatically made through the HMRC taxation system.
- Interest is charged on the loans (e.g. 2020/21=5.4%).



Repayment Examples

- A graduate begins a job with a £30,000 salary per annum.
- £3,425 of the graduate's salary is over the set threshold (£30,000-£26,575)
- The graduate pays 9% of the gap between the threshold & salary= £308.25
- This is split into monthly payments = £25.69 approx.

Income each year before tax	Monthly repayment (Approx.)
£26,575	£0
£28,000	£10.69
£30,000	£25.69
£35,000	£64.19
£40,000	£100.69




