DIY Mortar Board Design

Follow along with our video and create your own Mortar Board for your graduation service!

To complete this craft, you will need:

- Two pieces of card/ paper (Your choice of colour)
- Sellotape
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Pencil/pen
- Step 1 Turn your paper portrait and measure 24CM vertically down one side of the page. Make a mark of this measurement.
- Step 2 Draw a straight line horizontally across the page from your 24CM mark. Now cut along the line you have drawn. (Set aside your now square piece of paper and keep the extra paper you have cut away for later).
- Step 3 Grab your second piece of paper and turn that piece portrait. Along the bottom of your page, measure 10.5CM. This should be roughly the middle of your page.
- Step 4 With this mark, draw a straight line all the way to the top of page. Now cut along that line.
- Step 5 Now you should have two strips of paper.
 Tape the end of the two strips together to make one long strip.
 - Step 6 On the edge of your paper, measure 2.5CM down. Then create a fold that is 2.5CM all the way down your strip.

DIY Mortar Board Design

- Step 7 Now cut triangular slits all the way down your fold.
- Step 8 With the triangular slits facing inwards, wrap the long strip of paper around your head and tape them together at the correct width for your head. (This will be the base of your hat).
- Step 9 Now you have the base of your hat, grab your square piece of paper. Place the square paper on the table at an angle to make it a diamond. Place the base of your hat onto the paper with the triangular slits facing inwards.
- Step 10 Now tape the triangular slits to the square paper. Use enough tape to make sure it feels secure and stuck together!
- Step 11 Using the leftovers from your first piece of paper, cut out a small circle.
- Step 13 With the rest of the left over paper, cut out as many long, skinny strips of paper as you can. Then grab some tape and stick all the strips together at the top to make a tassel for your hat.
- Step 14 Stick the tassels onto your small circle you have already cut out. Then stick the small circle to the top of your hat on the right side.



 Step 14 - Now you should have your finished Mortar Board, ready for your graduation service!
