Key Stage 1

READING PARTNERS 🎓

Children with above average reading skills are more likely to have good mental wellbeing than those whose skills are below average. UCW's reading partners are students who work with Key Stage 1 pupils to enhance these key reading skills.

What's involved?

- Six weekly sessions with a handful of pupils in year 1 or 2.
- One-to-one sessions of 20 minutes per pupil.

Professor Fluffy's Education Adventure introduces further and higher education to year 5 and 6 pupils. The interactive activities allow pupils to explore different career paths and the learning journey they may follow to achieve their goals.

What's involved?

- A campus tour of our university facilities.
